
J. Franklyn Bourne Bar Association will also host its annual high school oratorical contest on February 25,

FIVE THINGS I WANT YOU TO KNOW ABOUT FAMILY LAW A BROWN BAG LUNCH WITH JUDGE JULIA B. WEATHERLY AND THE PGCBA YOUNG LAWYERS' SECTION





1. Why are Divorce Cases Hard?

Clients are emotional and you do not have the training to handle it. So: Educate yourself on the psychological issues involving divorce and custody by reading a book or taking a class.

Recognize and respect your client's grief, anger and emotional reaction to the trauma in their lives at this time. Develop a network of mental health counselors and therapists to whom you can refer clients. Discover the resources for counseling in your community. Become knowledgeable about health insurance coverage for marital or family counseling. Seek out programs for kids who parents are separated or hostile.

Distinguish your role as the attorney from a therapist or friend, and hold yourself to it.

Keep Kleenex in your office.

2. Why are family cases rewarding?

Most clients are not murderers. They are us, and our families, and our friends – people worth helping.

You can assist with their problems: get the divorce, develop a parenting plan; establish child support; improve their financial plan or get them to the professionals who can, like Consumer Credit Counseling.

There is a lot of family work out there for attorneys, even with the increased numbers of self-represented litigants.

3. Assess the Case early.

Determine what issues need to be resolved.

What issues will be contested? Hotly or mildly?

What concessions or agreements is your client amenable to? This is the time to start educating your client so they can make reasonable and well reasoned decisions.

Determine if there are domestic violence issues. Learn what options and protections are available for your client.

Get a handle on the financial issues: assets, cash, income, expenses.

4. Discuss with your client how they will pay for the litigation. Learn to give reasonable assessments on how much time this type of litigation will require. Talk candidly with your client how much your representation will cost.

How much do average cases costs? At \$250 per hour a case that takes

- 20 hours will cost \$5,000
- 40 hours will cost \$10,000
- 60 hours will cost \$15,000

How will the client pay you? Are there savings? Plenty of income? Rich aunt? New boyfriend?

The question is not just if they can pay a retainer fee. Inquire with the client whether they can pay for the entire litigation process.

If you require payment for your time and services in this case and the client is clearly unable to fund the cost of the litigation consider whether you will take the case on reduced fee basis or as a pro bono case. But be very cautious about entering the case, spending the client's retainer, and bailing out before the end is in sight. You have not provided much assistance to the client, the client is disgruntled, and the court just might not let you out of the case, which brings us back to pro bono.

5. Know your own financial needs – essential for solo practitioners and small firms and darn useful for everyone else.

How much are your average monthly expenses incurred to run your business? We used to call this your "nut" and it includes rent, phones, computers, employees, bookkeepers, paper, business cards, photocopy machine, the cost for the man who repairs the photocopy machine, taxes, periodic or yearly expenses amortized



to a monthly amount. How much do you need to earn per month before you have any money to take home and feed yourself?

How much to you need to pay yourself? Complete your own financial statement. You make your clients do them so take the time and do one for yourself. Know how much you need to earn to maintain your household.

Have a plan how you are going to earn the amount of income you need to run your business and feed yourself. Then spending some effort planning how you will get clients, and be prepared to put your time and energy into marketing your practice. Remember that practicing law is a profession, but it is also a business. Be successful.



Our January article focused largely on the foreclosure problem in our county, and we will continue to do so since it does not seem this crisis will end any time soon. According

to the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development over 27 percent of all foreclosures statewide occurred in Prince George County in the third quarter of this year (the largest share among all Maryland jurisdictions), and an estimated 18,000 notices of intent are slated to be delivered soon to the residents in this jurisdiction.

We will continue to bring attention to free available trainings for attorneys who would like to help stem this crisis, share some of our success stories, and publicly thank the attorneys who assist our clients.

Free Foreclosure Prevention Training for Lawyers

The Pro Bono Resources Center (PBRC) provides training to attorneys who would like to help but lack knowledge and training. The training is in exchange for a pro bono commitment. PBRC also provides a listserv for attorneys to actively communicate with each other and discuss various foreclosure issues in real-time!

Foreclosure Success Story

A disabled homeowner fell behind on mortgage payments due to hospitalization. The homeowner requested a loan modification from Wachovia but was denied because the lender claimed they did not receive the required paperwork. The homeowner claims all paperwork requested was submitted. An Order to Docket was filed and the homeowner sought the assistance of a CLS pro bono attorney, to negotiate payment of arrears and stop the foreclosure. With the help of our volunteer attorney John Gable, the homeowner received a finalized modification. The homeowner is very pleased that the matter could be resolved and she was able to remain in her home. Thank you John!


