Dear Colleagues



PGCBA's Nominating Committee, chaired by Immediate Past Judge Nicholas E. Rattal, is seeking candidates for the positions of Secretary and Directors for the Prince George's County Bar Association Board.

The deadline for submitting applications is 5:00 p.m. Friday, April 13, 2012. Elections will be held at the Bar Association's Annual Meeting on Tuesday, June 5, 2012.

Minimum qualifications for an officer position are delineated by the By-laws. Access to the Wi-Fi Service is available in the law Library, Jury Assembly, Duvall 2nd Floor Courtroom Hallway, 1st and 2nd Floor Breezeway (Connecting the Duvall and Marbury building), Marbury Expansion Hallway 1st & 2nd Floor and Cafeteria.

These hotspots do not require the user to obtain a prior passcode. The "Hot Spots" will allow access for one hour per log in.

10 Things You Should Know About Our Civil System in Prince George's County

1. We truly attempt to be lawyer friendly From start to finish our efforts are to make it easier for attorneys not harder. Help us by putting your email address on your appearance and after your address in every pleading.

2. You set the trial date for trials lasting one or two days. Two day trials must begin on Monday or Tuesdays. One day trials begin only on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Just talk with opposing counsel, fill out the forms which are on the web <u>www.princegeorgescountymd.gov</u> and follow the directions.

3. Cases from start to finish must be completed within 18 months. The "try by date" is eighteen months from the date the plaintiff files the lawsuit. Please remember that if you file motions, you should consult the current chambers assignment which can be found at <u>www.princegeorgescountymd.gov</u>. Please remember that if it is a dispositive motion, you must send the judge a courtesy copy of your motion and if you are responding to a dispositive motion, you should also send the judge a courtesy copy of your response.

4. Pre-trial dates can be changed by you. Calendar Management gives you a pre-trial date. This may be changed and rescheduled with the consent of both counsel for sixty days from the set pre-trial date. Again, have all counsel agree to a new date, fill out the form on the web <u>www.princegeorgescountymd.gov</u> and follow the directions. Have a particular scheduling order problem, file a motion or request a phone conference with the Civil Coordinating Judge.

5. Interpreters!!! If your client, a witness or someone involved in the case needs an interpreter, please file the request for interpreter which can be found on the web at <u>www.princegeorgescountymd.</u> gov and follow directions. Just noting that you need an interpreter

on the pre-trial statement and having the Judge check the box on the pre-trial report does not get an interpreter. The earlier you request an interpreter the better as some languages are more difficult than others.

6. Communication between your office and the court is needed as trial approaches. If Calendar Management or the Civil Coordinating Judge's Chambers calls you, return the call and tell us if the trial is in fact going forward and your best time estimate. If we can eliminate the need to call jurors it makes life easier for the potential jurors and their families.



7. Unless you are specifically assigned or in a Track 5 case, the day before trial and we like them before 3:00 p.m.; you should fax to the Civil Coordinating Judge's chambers **301-780-8063**, your voir dire, suggested verdict sheet and all jury instructions. If you are asking for a pattern civil jury instruction, just give the appropriate cite and the name of the jury instruction. If you are asking for a special instruction, please mark it, Plaintiff/Defendant Special Instruction Number. Remember to give the appropriate legal authority for the instruction.

8. Come to court prepared to present your exhibits. Know the order you are going to present them to the clerk. If you have more than 25 exhibits, you need to pre-mark the exhibits and you should call **301-952-5016** for the procedure and follow the civil clerk's direction.





9. All civil trials begin at 8:45 a.m. We pick civil juries first in our county. Please arrive prior to 8:45 a.m. as most judges will be on the bench at 8:45 a.m. Judges do not want to pick a civil jury behind the criminal juries. Many times one judge will pick the jury and then transfer the case to another judge who is handling pre-trial conferences. Inform both the judge picking the jury and the trial judge immediately of any scheduling difficulties.

10. At the end of the trial, just after the jury has been discharged determine who is keeping the evidence that has been presented. A good practice is to ask the clerk for a list of the exhibits presented during the course of the trial.

Finally, as the Civil Coordinating Judge, I am always available. On a daily basis my staff is answering your questions and we find great satisfaction in helping counsel. If something is not going right in your case, you may request a phone conference with me. The appropriate way to request such a phone conference is to email me with opposing counsel receiving immediately your email. Generally it is easier to send it both to me and my executive administrative assistant. Our emails are <u>legreen@co.pg.md.us</u> and <u>lmhester@co.pg.md.us</u>. Generally all phone conference calls are set at 3:45 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. If you think we should be doing something different or have a suggestion, simply email me.

GET HEALTHY TODAY | by Edith Lawson-Jackson



Wonderful Water

It's easy to forget to consume an adequate amount of water in winter months, but your body needs to be properly hydrated

even when it's cold outside. Water is one of the most essential components of the human body, affecting numerous functions of the body. This is something that does not change with the seasons. Water is necessary to regulate body temperature, it cushions and protects vital organs, and acts within the cells to transport nutrients and dispel waste. Without water, it would be impossible for a human to survive for more than one week.

The human body loses water daily, just by the performance of basic, every day activities. It's actually recommended that the average adult female consume 2.7 liters of water daily and that the average adult male consume 3.7 liters daily. This is just to replace fluids lost that are necessary for the healthy function of the body's internal organs. Active adults require even more than this, depending on the duration of their exercise sessions and the ambient temperature in which they are exercising. It may seem hard to believe, but an adult can lose a quart of water or more in just one hour of intense exercise. Because water composes 75% of all muscle tissue, and 10% of all fatty tissue, the loss of substantial fluid can have a recognizable effect on the body. Athletes who are dehydrated even minimally can notice diminished athletic performance. More pronounced dehydration can lead to muscle fatigue, and loss of coordination. In a severely dehydrated state, a person can suffer heat exhaustion and even heat stroke - even if they are not exercising. You may also suffer other non-exercised induced symptoms of dehydration such as cramps, constipation, and headache when your body is not adequately hydrated.

I've heard people say that they don't like the "taste" of water, or that it's too difficult to drink 3 liters of water every day. Well, that's an easy problem to get around. If you can drink 3 liters of soda or other beverage daily, then you can make water a palatable substitute. One thing you can do is add flavored tea packs or other water enhancements to your water. There are all kinds of portable water enhancers available that add flavor, as well as other nutrients to your water. Typically they come in small, easy to carry pouches and can easily be poured into your water or water bottle. As well, there are water products available such as Vitamin Water, Smart Water, etc that come in a variety of flavors. Drinking water really is just something you have to get into the habit of doing. Once you commit to doing it, by taking steps such as keeping a liter of water on your desk, you'll find that you can drink a lot more water than you thought you could.

Keep in mind too that all of the "water" that your body requires doesn't have to be pure water, or even a liquid per se. Tea, lemonade, smoothies, and fruit juices count towards the water intake minimums that the human body requires for proper functioning. In fact, even certain foods such as soups, fruits and vegetables can help to meet the body's water needs. What's important is to try to monitor how much fluid you are consuming. You want most of it to be either plain water or a flavored water beverage or a clear liquid such as iced tea or lemonade. Having a minimum of 16 ounces of water or iced tea with every meal will get you halfway to your daily goal. And if you keep one bottle of water on your desk that you drink over the course of the day, you almost entirely meet your body's daily fluid requirements. Eat a few pieces of fruit and some veggies each day and have a glass of water at bedtime, and you're there!

You also want to listen to your body to help you determine if you are properly

hydrated. If you are feeling thirsty, you are probably already slightly dehydrated. So drink a glass of water the moment your throat or mouth feels a little dry. And if you know you will be engaging in moderate levels of exercise, start hydrating yourself the day before by consciously drinking 8 ounce quantities every few hours, plus drink at least 16 ounces while exercising and 16 ounces immediately after exercising. If you take medications or supplements, instead of taking in just enough water to get your meds down, drink an entire 16 ounces of water each time you take your medications. These are all steps that will ensure that you maintain proper levels of hydration for your body to function optimally. One easy way you can monitor your hydration levels is by paying attention to your urine color. Yes, this may seem a little weird, but you should always take notice of its color. It should always be a pale yellow, and if you are very well hydrated it will be nearly colorless. First thing in the morning and for a couple hours after taking supplements, the color will be darker, however. But this will easily tell you what your state of hydration is.

Athletes should keep in mind that they lose even greater amounts of fluid when exercising and often lose more than just water. It's also possible to lose electrolytes and sodium during fairly long bouts of exercise. While it may sound like a good thing to sweat out sodium, the body does need to maintain a certain balance of sodium, and so if you notice salt stains or white rings and spots on your workout clothing, that means that the sweat you excreted contained high amounts of sodium. To prevent water intoxication, if you're losing high levels of sodium in your sweat, you should replenish during and after exercise with a sports drink (that restores electrolytes) instead of water.

I'm actually feeling just a bit thirsty right now. So let's break and drink to your health! BROWN BAG





MENU CHANGES FROM JUDGE FEMIA

February 21, 2012

To my dear friends and colleagues at the bar:

As most of you know that for the last thirty-one years I've been presiding over what we euphemistically refer to as CA's--which really is the Circuit Court's forum for handling appeals and jury trial prayers from the District Court. Also, if you practice in that environment, you realize that I almost never stray from my way of handling cases. Everyone knows with a high level of probability how I'll treat the cases before me. Also, if you've been around for more than a little while you know that whenever I believe that it has become necessary for me to tweak my "ways", I attempt to make the practicing bar well aware of any anticipated change before it comes to pass. (If memory serves, my last "spasm" was in 2004 and dealt with drunk drivers.) Well, my friends, I have a "tweak" coming on. This letter is my effort to spread the word just as far as I can.

Those who have been in attendance in courtroom 1410 over the last month or so have heard me announce a new way that I intend to handle driving without or while suspended or revoked. It has always been my belief that our community is much better off forcing drivers to get reinstated as lawful licensees than collecting fines and jail time. To that end I have always given drivers so charged ample time to do what is necessary-pay tickets, take tests, deal with out of state problems, make an arrangement with non-support, make a deal with attorneys holding judgments, or whatever--to get back a valid driving status. But problems have arisen and they are becoming more acute since such offenses constitute about 30% of my docket.

I usually allow defendants three to six months between plea and sentence (depending on the complexity of their problems) to get straight with their State. What has been happening is that about 70-80% of those defendants are taking advantage of the situation and doing nothing to help themselves. They beg for more time and usually I give it to them. No more. Constant continuances swell my dockets artificially. But more important is the fact that continuances increase the workloads of both the criminal clerks' office and calendar management—neither of which offices need more work—the SAO and the PD's office. It's sad that the conscientious have to suffer along with the "not so," so there is really no other way for me to do this.

So here's the "tweak." If on the status date (or the "will call" date) the defendant has:

- 1. Straightened out his or her license— PBJ and costs;
- 2. Wants to or has spent a night in jail—PBJ, no costs and a warning that that doesn't clear up his or her license problems;
- 3. G-G, \$100.00 and costs;
- 4. That ever-popular "trial" selection.

This tweak will be imposed on all cases prayed or appealed on or after the Ides of March 2012. Of course, as always, I will respect and impose any agreements between counsel.

Now on another subject--and I offer this merely as a "heads up" so as to avoid counsel's being embarrassed by clients. those of you who practice regularly in the CA court know, Ms. Connie Loureiro represents the State, not for legal matters, but for informational purposes. Those who know Ms. Loureiro know she is extremely conscientious and a well prepared paralegal. Well now she has even greater resources with a laptop in the courtroom. Not only is she prepared on the facts of the cases, she can also look up the motor vehicle records, the jail records, the defendant's records and the starting times of races at the various tracks in Maryland. So just as a word to the wise, it's probably in the defendant's best interest that he or she not be caught lying to the court and embarrassing him or herself and counsel in the bargain. Though I'm not of a mind to institute it just yet, if the lying, which now seems to be endemic, continues on apace, I might be inclined to add a tier to my dispositions which doubles the punishment for liars-just a thought for the moment.
