Dear Fellow Members of the Bar,

I hope everyone had a happy and fun summer and survived the heat wave of the last month. As the fall approaches (and football season) the activities of the Bar will pick up to full speed. The Bar year starts off with the Missouri Celebration on the 29th of September and I encourage all members to attend this event. The deadline for reservations is September 10 so please send your reservation and payment in as soon as possible. As you know the Bar Association members passed an Amendment to the By-Laws for an interview portion to be added to the voting portion for our Bar's recommendation for judicial office. By the time this newsjournal comes out the Commission will have been set up and will have started preparing to conduct interviews for the judicial vacancies.

In that vein, the Board of Directors has approved a new voting procedure for judicial selections. We will no longer be sending out ballots by mail. Our members will now vote on line. This new voting procedure will allow our members to vote at their computer via their email to a secure site. Each member will be notified by email when the election process starts. They will merely have to click onto the provided site and cast their vote. The system will record their vote and keep track of who has voted but not who they voted for. This system should be up and running by October. So I am reminding members that when there is a judicial vacancy do not be expecting an envelope with a ballot from the Bar Association. All voting documents will be received via email. If anyone has questions about how this voting program works, or any other questions about the procedure, feel free to contact the Bar Association. Obviously the key to the success of this program is accurate email addresses. If any members have changed their email and not notified the Bar Office please do so immediately.

The Board has also formed a new committee on fund raising. As you know in these lean economic times, we have had to make cuts to the Bar budget but we are still trying to seek ways of increasing our revenues. This committee has taken on the task of looking into possible fund raising events. On that note, the committee is planning a silent auction at the holiday party. It is the committee's hope to have a few up-scale fun items to auction off.

# Judge Sheila R. Tillerson Adams Named Prince George's County and 7th Circuit Administrative Judge



(ANNAPOLIS, Md. – Aug. 9, 2010) Judge Sheila R. Tillerson Adams will be the new administrative judge for Prince George's County

Circuit Court and the 7th Circuit, which includes Calvert, Charles, Prince George's and St. Mary's counties. The historic appointment, announced today by Chief Judge Robert M. Bell of the Maryland Court of Appeals, will be effective Sept. 4.

In this dual appointment, Judge Adams will be serving multiple roles. As the county administrative judge, she will supervise all judges, officers and employees of the Prince George's County Circuit Court, the assigning of judges to cases, and the court's budget. As administrative judge for the 7th Circuit, Judge Adams will also be responsible for the administration of the courts within the judicial circuit and will supervise Calvert, Charles and St. Mary's counties' administrative judges.

Judge Adams succeeds Chief Judge William D. Missouri, the current administrative judge of the Prince George's County Circuit Court and the 7th Circuit, who will retire Sept. 3 after more than 25 years on the bench. Judge Missouri was appointed to the Prince George's County Circuit Court in January 1988, and was named county administrative judge in October 1992. He was appointed administrative judge for the 7th Circuit, and has served in that capacity since, May 1997. Before joining the Circuit Court, from 1985 through 1987, Judge Missouri served on the District Court of Maryland, sitting in Prince George's County. He served as that District's administrative judge from 1987 until his appointment to the Circuit Court.

"Judge Missouri has been an invaluable asset and a superlative leader for the Maryland Judiciary, serving the citizens of this State in many important capacities during his long and distinguished career. His star has shone bright indeed during his stewardship of the Prince George's County Circuit Court and the 7th Circuit. On behalf of the Judiciary, I express profound gratitude for Bill's extraordinary and selfless service to the people of Maryland, and in particular to the 7th Circuit." Judge Bell said. "I am confident that Judge Adams will continue the fine leadership for which Judge Missouri's tenure is known," he added. "She brings exceptional leadership and management skills, in her own right, and that makes her uniquely qualified to fill these demanding and responsible positions and build upon Judge Missouri's excellent example."

Judge Adams was appointed, in June 1993, a judge of the District Court of Maryland sitting in Prince George's County, where she served until December 1996, when she was appointed to the Circuit Court for Prince George's County. Her experience in preparation for the bench included being a staff attorney in the Domestic Law Unit of the Legal Aid Bureau, Inc., from 1982 to 1984; an assistant state's attorney for Prince George's County, from 1984 to 1988, ascending to chief of the Sexual Assault Unit; and deputy county attorney for Prince George's County, from 1988 to 1993. Judge Adams graduated from Morgan State University in 1979 and earned her law degree from the Howard University School of Law in 1982. She also received a Master of Laws degree in taxation from the Georgetown University Law Center in 1987.

Judge Adams is a member of the American, National, Maryland State, Women's and Prince George's County Bar Associations and is a past president of the J. Franklyn Bourne Bar Association, Inc. She serves on the State's Drug and Alcohol Council, and has served on the Judiciary's Public Awareness Committee and Ad Hoc Committee on the Implementation of Family Divisions. For the past decade, she has served as chairman of the Building Committee for the Circuit Court for Prince George's County. In this capacity, she oversaw the expansion of the Marbury Wing and the renovation of the Duvall Wing, culminating in the grand reopening of the historic courthouse in May 2009.

"I am confident that Judge Adams will be an excellent leader and administrator," Judge Missouri said. "It is gratifying to know, that as I prepare to retire as administrative judge for Prince George's County and the 7th Circuit, the administrative duties that are integral to the well being of all judges and staff will be in competent hands. After all, Judge Adams is an erudite, affable, organized and common sensed jurist who has consistently demonstrated her management abilities and leadership skills. She is an excellent choice for these positions."

"I am deeply honored to receive these appointments," Judge Adams said. "I would like to thank Chief Judge Bell for the confidence he has shown in me with these appointments, and of course, I am especially grateful and thankful to Judge Missouri for the wonderful example of leadership he has provided, which I hope to continue."

#### AGING TO PERFECTION

This month's article addresses health and fitness concerns that senior members of our community are faced with.

While the information in this month's column will specifically be geared towards seniors, it is information that anyone can benefit from - both now and in the future. 
other benefits such as a lower risk for certain types of cancer. Finally, exercise is probably one of the best allnatural laxatives. This is an especially helpful benefit for seniors because the improved digestion aids in weight management and improved nutrient absorption.

Now that I've highlighted some of the benefits of seniors incorporating a fitness program into their schedule, there are some crucial points that seniors need to know about how to get started. Firstly, if you're someone who hasn't been engaging in any type of muscular conditioning program in recent times, you ought to begin with calisthenics or endurance type exercise and forego weight bearing exercises during the beginning phases of your program. There are plenty of options for cardiovascular type exercises that provide mild muscle stimulation at the same time. If possible, seniors should try to engage in this type of exercise activity four to five times per week. How much time you spend exercising, as well as how you exercise, will be impacted by several factors including your heart health, lung capacity, and joint health. There are many conditions that could affect what types of activities you can engage in. These conditions include, but are not limited to, uncontrolled hypertension, diabetes, angina, postheart attack or post-bypass, heart valve disease, arthritis, post-surgical/ neuromuscular rehabilitation, and disorders. The key is to start by discussing with your health care practitioner that you are interested

in starting an exercise program, and soliciting his/her suggestions as to how to approach such a program.

Once you get the go-ahead to begin a program, including a calisthenics/ cardio type fitness regime, you want to begin slowly. Sometimes, it's necessary for those who've been inactive to start with as little as two minutes of activity three times per day until they can manage to do a straight session of 10 minutes or so of walking or some other low impact activity daily. After achieving a 10 minute non-stop session four times per week for a couple of weeks, the goal for seniors might then be to work up to a 30 minute session four to five times per week. At this point, this is an ideal level of cardio exercise for seniors to improve health and reap the health benefits I've already discussed.

After becoming well acclimated to this initial phase of exercise (usually about 3-4 weeks), you should be ready to incorporate some gentle resistance type exercises, such as light hand

weights and perhaps rubber tension exercise tubes. This is where it's crucial to have qualified supervision. If you're going to be using weights, it's important to start off with a personal trainer who has experience working with seniors, or at least have a qualified instructor demonstrate what exercises you should be engaging in. Remember, never use heavy weights. Always start out light and perform higher repetitions. After mastering this level of some basic light-weight movements for every body part, you may be ready to also incorporate some variable-resistance exercise machinery, under qualified supervision. A good resistance training program for seniors should include about three days per week of training which covers the entire body over a week's period, with a day of rest between each day of training.

It's especially important to remember that every exercise session should begin and end with a flexibility and range of motion phase that involves stretching. The entire body should be stretched to warm it up and prepare it for the exercises to follow, before each session. After a workout session, stretching and flexibility training is helpful to relax and stretch back out any muscles that were contracted during the training session. Further, this post-workout stretching assists with removing the built up lactic acid from muscles and allows for increased oxygen flow through the muscles. An additional benefit is that stretching both before and after exercising limbers up joints that have been stiffened by arthritis and improves range of motion for those suffering from arthritis. Keep in mind that stretching shouldn't "hurt". Do not stretch to the point of pain or severe discomfort.

It's never too late to start a fitness program and substantially improve your health and quality of life. Seniors are not excluded. In fact, seniors are presented with a great deal of benefits which can be reaped if they embark

upon a fitness regime. While many of us use the excuse that we don't have time to exercise, seniors generally have more free time on their hands and have no excuse for not fitting in regular workout sessions. If you can't make it to the gym, look into mallwalker programs, spring/summer/ fall gardening programs, or even volunteering to walk neighborhood pets. Where there's a will, there's a way to get it in. When I can't get to a gym, I'll do sit-ups, push-ups, squats, and toe touches (or jog in place) for the duration of every commercial that comes on television while I'm watching my favorite hour-long program. That's about fifteen minutes right there! And who says you have to stop when the commercials go off? My point is, there really isn't any excuse not to exercise....especially

for seniors who have a little more time on their hands and who would really benefit from incorporating this type of activity into their daily schedules.

Fitness is golden. Meet with your doctor, then get going today. And don't ignore the other components of good health which include eating a wellbalanced diet, not smoking, and going to regularly scheduled doctor's visits. Seniors should view their retirement years as an opportunity to do all the things they never had the time, money, or sense to do when they were young. Be courageous, get out there and embark upon all types of activities that your health condition permits... go horse back riding, learn to swim, learn to Salsa dance, become a Yoga Diva, run a marathon. Youth is wasted on the young...take that to heart!



#### CHASENBOSCOLO WINS LANDMARK CASE REPRESENTING FORMER NHL HOCKEY PLAYER, JAMIE HUSCROFT – RULING PAVES WAY FOR OTHER INJURED PRO ATHLETES IN D.C.

District of Columbia Court of Appeals Sides with Injured Minor League Professional Athletes Under Contract with a Major League Club - Can Make Claims Under the District's Workers' Compensation Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. — (August 3, 2010) — The District of Columbia Court of Appeals upheld an award of District of Columbia workers' compensation benefits to a former minor league player in the Washington Capitals' hockey organization, Jamie Huscroft (No. 08-AA-1476). The outcome of the case enables minor league professional athletes under two-way contracts to seek workers' compensation benefits from the parent club.

Huscroft played for the Portland Pirates, the Capitals' American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate from Portland, Maine. During an AHL game in Quebec, Canada on October 13, 2000, he sustained head injuries which brought an end to his hockey playing career. Huscroft filed for workers' compensation benefits in the District of Columbia alleging that the principal service for which he was retained by the Capitals was to play in the National Hockey League. Washington-area law firm, ChasenBoscolo, represented Huscroft and argued that the time he spent in Portland was ancillary and preparatory to the principal service he was hired to perform. Additionally, the firm maintained that Huscroft's affiliation agreement gave the Capitals control over every aspect of his employment in Portland.

"This is an important case for professional athletes who work for organizations that call the District of Columbia home," says Benjamin Boscolo, partner at ChasenBoscolo Injury Lawyers. "This case enables minor league professional athletes under contract with a major league club to file claims against their parent clubs when in the best interest to do so."

The Huscroft case reinforces ChasenBoscolo's experience in the area of sports law and high-profile workers' compensation litigation. Boscolo, lead attorney in the Huscroft proceeding in collaboration with his colleague, Gerry Herz, recently co-wrote a chapter in a textbook on the law of professional sports. The textbook titled, "The Law of Professional and Amateur Sports," focuses heavily on pro athletes and the law of workers' compensation.
